

Prof. Bharathi Harishankar, currently the Vice Chancellor of Avinashilingam Institute for Home Science and Higher Education for Women, is a former Professor of English and the founding Head of the department of Women's Studies at Madras University. A Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, she has 118 research publications and is a renowned academic in the fields of Gender Studies, Postcolonial Studies, and Literary Theory. Notably, she pioneered India's first Gender Lab in collaboration with Sutherland Global Services.

Prof. Jibu Mathew George is a Professor of English Literature at The English and Foreign Languages University, Hyderabad, with expertise in Literary Modernism, Critical Theory, Philosophy of Religion, Mythology, and Holocaust Studies. Holding multiple degrees across disciplines, he has authored *Ulysses Quotīdiānus* (2016) and *The Ontology of Gods* (2017). He has edited and co-edited several works, including *De Natura Fidei* (2021). He has received international recognition as a Research Fellow at the Zürich James Joyce Foundation, and serves as Director of EFLU's Centre for Translation and Interpretation.
